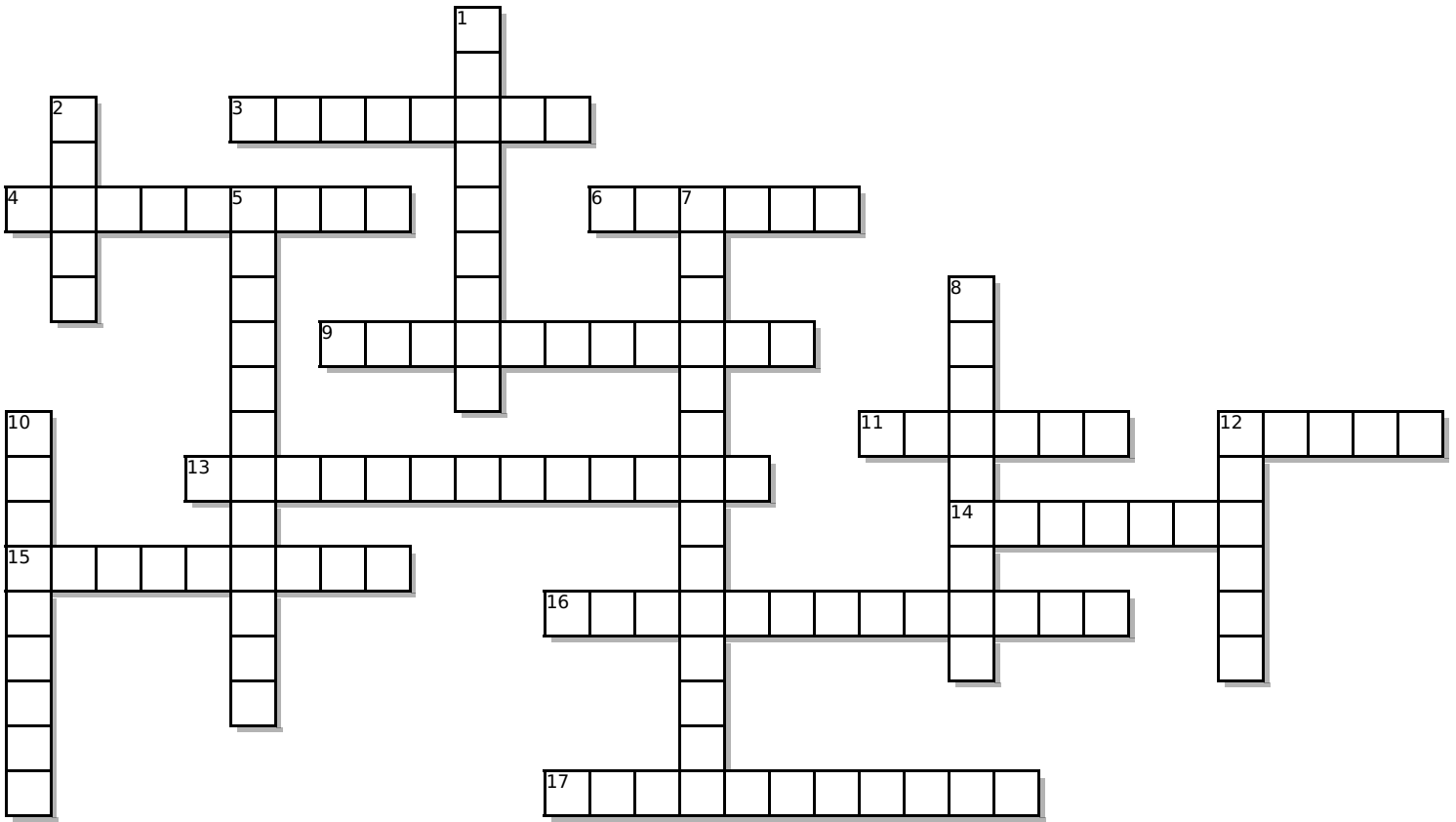


The Gunpowder Plot and Bonfire Night



ACROSS

- 3 The wealthy recusant woman who was arrested after being implicated in the plot, but released, and who hid the Jesuit priest who was linked to the plot.
- 4 This lord received an anonymous tip-off about the plot.
- 6 This sweet apple treat is traditionally enjoyed on Bonfire Night.
- 9 This Jesuit priest was executed after being implicated in the Gunpowder Plot.
- 11 A sweet treat made from black treacle which is traditionally enjoyed on Bonfire Night.
- 12 In the past, children would make an effigy of Guy Fawkes (clothes stuffed with newspaper) to burn on a bonfire on 5th November and go around houses to collect "a for the Guy".
- 13 This property, that used to be in Staffordshire, was the setting of the shoot-out between the Sheriff of Worcestershire and his men, and some of the plotters.
- 14 The surname of the brothers Robert and Thomas, who were Gunpowder Plotters.
- 15 The Gunpowder Plotters sought to

assassinate King James I and replace him with Princess

- 16 This man appears to have been the real leader of the Gunpowder Plotters.
- 17 This member of the royal bodyguard leased the undercroft under the House of Lords for the plot.

DOWN

- 1 These hand-held sticks that emit colour flames and sparks are popular on Bonfire Night.
- 2 Three barrels of gunpowder were stored ready to blow up under Westminster.
- 5 A game often played with a fruit at Halloween and Bonfire Night.
- 7 This man has long been suspected of sending the letter which gave the tip off about the plot.
- 8 This man was found in the cellars beneath Westminster with barrels of gunpowder on the night 4/5th November 1605.
- 10 Bonfire Night is celebrated with lots of these.
- 12 A sticky ginger-flavoured cake traditionally enjoyed on Bonfire Night.
